Before bonfire night we had a visit from the Fire Service where children learned about firework safety. They were also able to climb in the fire appliance, turn on the blue flashing lights and squirt the hose!

All classes have had a visit from the local librarian Katy, she came to read to the children and told them all about the benefits of joining Rothbury library.

We also had an excellent visit from a member of the **RNLI**. We learned a lot about water safety and the job of a RNLI volunteer. The children were able to try on the safety clothes worn by the volunteers which they thoroughly enjoyed.



Our Big Breakfast this term was as popular as ever. The sale of bacon rolls raised £150 for the RNLI. (Each year we choose one charity and donate the profits of our Big Breakfast to that particular good cause)

We had fun dressing up for Children in Need and we raised £128.50 which we have sent off to the charity.

Recently we had a very successful book fair selling £446.87 worth of books, so we are able to spend our 40% commission on more books for classrooms which is fantastic.

All of the children have been involved in our annual Anti-bullying project day this term.

Thanks to our amazing staff who were incredibly busy clearing up the mess in the Early years unit so that we could get up and running again so quickly. WINTER ILLNESS

We have seen increasing numbers of children affected by diarrhoea, vomiting, chicken pox, flu and some cases of scarlett fever in school children this term. Please ensure that you keep your children off school for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness and/or diarrhoea and encourage frequent handwashing. If your child has chicken pox they will be infectious to others up until their last spot has crusted over. Children with high temperatures should be kept at home until the temperature is back to normal.

Please ensure that your child has a warm waterproof coat. We will still have outdoor play times in the rain.
