

## **Rothbury First School PE & Sports Premium**

The Government provides £150 million per year to schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on PE and sport provision in schools. Rothbury First School has used this funding to ensure that all pupils have access to high quality PE, appropriate sporting competition and opportunities to lead a healthy and active lifestyle.

## 2024-25 Planned PE and Sports Premium Expenditure

Under the Primary PE and Sport funding initiative, in 2024/25 we will receive £16,000 to support PE and sport in our school. The impact of the funding must be considered in terms of these 5 key indicators.

- increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- increase participation in competitive sport

## We propose to spend this money in the following ways:

£3000	Support for transport to swimming lessons.	Swimming lessons took place in Autumn and Summer term for all children from Y1 - Y4	Children build on skills from previous lessons and many learn to swim before they leave our school
£2000	Support for children to attend sporting festivals with Dr Thomlinsons's Middle School as well as the Font Alliance, to include the cost of transport where applicable.	The children have attended almost all of the festivals this year at Dr Thomlinsons Middle School. Year 4 have attended a Font Alliance athletics event. All children from Y1-4 have been invited to become involved in the Font Alliance football events which have taken place 3 times this year.	The PE curriculum is designed to prepare pupils for competition. There is a full timetable of events planned for 2025-26.
£600	Support for bikeability lessons - provision of supervising adults.	Funding for provision was withdrawn and has therefore not taken place.	There are plans in place to run this in September 2025 with Y3/4 children.
£600	Provision of balance bike training for Reception and Year 1	Funding for provision was withdrawn and has therefore not taken place.	Plans to run this again next year with an alternative provider.
£600	Support for after-school clubs - provision of facilities	Ballet/Dance/Trident clubs have been taking place weekly	A culture of extra-curricular sport has been developed. The PE curriculum is designed to prepare pupils for competition.

£550	Support for PE - Paediatric First Aid certificate	2 members of staff have had their first aid training refreshed this year.	First Aid certificates last for a period of 3 years and a rotation of staff will allow more than one member of staff to be qualified at any one time.
£670	PE health and wellbeing resources	Additional resources have been purchased to support health and wellbeing during outdoor play times.	Play leaders have been put in place as well as resources provided for playground games. We now need to establish new play leaders. A quiet space has been established with small world toys and books.
