- Doubles to 20

Place Value within 50

- Count forwards and then backwards numbers 20 to 50

- Count in groups of tens and ones
- Partition numbers into tens and ones
- Count and estimate numbers to 50 on a number line

- Describe turns using language quarter, half, full and three quarter
- Describe position using language- left, right, forwards and backwards

Science

Living Things and their Habitats

- Compare the differences between things which are alive, dead and have never been alive.
- identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats.
- To gather and record data to help in answering auestions.
- Identify the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, how they adapt and how depend on each other.

Computing - Digital Photography

- To use a digital device to take a photograph.
- To describe what makes a good photograph.
- To decide how photographs can be improved.
- To use tools to change an image.

Geography-Holidays

- Recap 7 oceans 5 continents and UK countries and capitals
- Locate class holiday destinations on a map
- Understand that passports are required for travelling abroad
- Compare climates and understand how they affect what we can do and what we should wear
- Locate famous landmarks in popular destinations
- Know compass directions N, S, E and W

PE - Yoga

- Perform balances making their body tense, stretched and curled.
- Take body weight on different body parts, with and without apparatus.
- Demonstrate poses and movements that challenge their flexibility.

PE - Target games

- To consider how much power to apply when aiming at a target.
- To understand how to score using overarm and underarm throwing.
- To develop striking to a target.
- To develop hitting a moving target.
- To select and apply the appropriate skill to the target game.
- To show an improvement in my personal best.

Music - Music Express - Our bodies/Pattern

- To perform a steady beat at two different speeds
- Respond to change of mood in a piece of music with a slow and fast steady beat
- To identify a repeated rhythm pattern
- Combine a rhythm and a steady beat
- Play different patterns of steady beat within four beats
- Perform and create simple three beat rhythms

- Block prints

RE - Easter
