We hope that you have had a chance to access Mrs Walton's Outdoor and Recycling Crafts blog muddylessons.wordpress.com. There are lovely activities suggested which we are sure that your child will have lots of fun with.

Home learning for the children in Early Years will be posted weekly as a memo on Tapestry. There will be suggested activities, websites for interactive games or information and also a weekly competition. Watch out for the memos which started on Monday 20th April. We still have a small number of parents whose accounts are not yet active. Please get in touch if you need help with this via the school office email. If you are already on Tapestry and have any questions or queries about your child's learning, please feel free to ask via an observation post as these are checked regularly. Thank you to all of the parents who have shared their child's work. It's been lovely to see what the children are up to at home.

Our resources have been designed to be completed at any time of day. We understand that there may be conflicts with accessing devices so there is no expectation for children to be logged in during school hours. A member of staff will be available online between 9.30 and 10.30 each weekday morning to answer any questions about that day's (or any previous day's) learning. You can leave questions at any time in the Google Classroom stream but please be aware that they may not be answered until the next working day.

It is vitally important that we keep our children safe online. Last week we produced an online safety update and sent out a link. This is available via our website. There has been a reported increase in criminals attempting to exploit children and vulnerable adults during this situation. If you are unsure about anything you are sent, or anything that your child is accessing online, then please contact Mr Grimes or Mrs Brotherton.

# ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR THE NATIONAL MEAL VOUCHER SCHEME?

This is an extract from the NCC webpage: https://www.northumberland.gov.uk/Education/Schools/Meals.aspx

If you are in receipt of one of the following benefits, please apply using the NCC online form. Once your application has been accepted, you would then be eligible for the National Meal Voucher Scheme from that point during the period of school closure. This is currently £15 per week per child.

- Universal Credit
  - Provided you have an annual net income of no more than £7,400
  - This is assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit
  - Provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run on
  - Paid four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
