



Rothbury First School PE & Sports Premium

The Government provides £150 million per year to schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on PE and sport provision in schools. Rothbury First School has used this funding to ensure that all pupils have access to high quality PE, appropriate sporting competition and opportunities to lead a healthy and active lifestyle.

2021-22 Planned PE and Sports Premium Expenditure

Under the Primary PE and Sport Funding initiative, in 2021/22 we will receive £16,630 to support PE and sport in our school. The impact of the funding must be considered in terms of these 5 key indicators. Also included is a carry over of £3,301 from 2020-21 academic year. Our total expenditure for 2021-22 totals £19,931

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

We propose to spend this money in the following ways;
